Medicaid Adult Dental Restored in FY2011

Next Steps Include Implementation, Continued Advocacy

Thank you Coalition members for all your letters, calls and visits with legislators over the past 15 months. Your voice has been heard! With the help of \$650 million in one-time federal stimulus dollars and Governor Granholm's signature, optional services which include dental have been restored within the Michigan Department of Community Health's 2010-11 budget. We celebrate this victory for Michigan's most vulnerable, but are realistic in our need for continued advocacy. 2011 will be a challenging year with a new Administration, many new legislators in Lansing as well as a continued decline in state revenues.

Implementation: CHAMPS and Claims Process

On Oct. 5, Medicaid issued [Provider Bulletin 10-47](#). The Bulletin provides guidance on procedure codes and co-pays. Of major interest to providers is the claims submission process. MDCH is currently making system edits and asks providers to hold these claims and submit them after Nov. 1. Claims for reinstated services will continue to reject as non-covered until system changes are implemented on Nov. 1, 2010. [See FY2011 Procedure Codes and Fees](#).

Continued Advocacy

The Coalition thanks bill sponsor Senator Roger Kahn (R-Saginaw Township) and legislative leaders Rep. Gary McDowell (D-Rudyard) and Senator Tony Stamas (R-Midland), as well as those lawmakers who voted in favor of SB 1152. Letters to the Editor have been sent thanking these legislators for their support. 2011 expects to be a volatile year with no help from federal stimulus dollars.
