Creating a Healthier Michigan

Governor Highlights Oral Health in New Health Initiative

On Wednesday, Governor Rick Snyder shared his vision for improving health and wellness across the state. The Governor presented his [Special Message to the Legislature on Health and Wellness](#) during a visit to the Heart of the City Health Center in Grand Rapids. Congratulations to member Chris Shea for hosting the governor. In Governor Snyder's remarks, he highlighted the connection between good oral health and overall health, and praised several oral health initiatives sponsored by the dental profession as part of his plan to make Michigan residents healthier. Snyder also encouraged legislators to consider expansion of Healthy Kids Dental to all of Michigan's 83 counties in the Fiscal Year 2013 budget cycle.

Delta Dental of Michigan Presents Major Grant

to Michigan Department of Community Health

Delta Dental of Michigan presented a \$250,000 grant to the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) on Sept. 2 to further advance oral health initiatives across the state. Dr. Thomas J. Fleszar, president and CEO of Delta Dental, presented this grant to MDCH officials at a special pre-game ceremony during Delta Dental's Smile Day at Comerica Park.

The grant will help fund three key components of the MDCH's oral health program, which supports the Department's mission to improve health, health care, and access to health care while lowering costs for Michigan residents.

Programs to be supported by the grant are:

1. Michigan Water Fluoridation Project, to give more Michigan communities access to fluoridated water.

2. Maternal Infant Health Program, to train home-visiting nurses in infant oral health and the application of fluoride varnish to children's teeth.
 3. SEAL! Michigan, to expand this dental sealant program to more schools in the state. This program, which last year reached more than 11,000 students across the state, is currently being reviewed as a best practice by the Association of State and Territorial Dental Directors.

Dental-related Death of Ohio Man

Sparks Active Discussion

The dental-related death of a 24-year-old, unemployed Ohio man has made national headlines and prompted intense discussion on listservs and blogs. Daily Kos, one of the nation's most visited political blogs, published a post about Kyle Willis' death that inspired more than 350 comments. Willis, who had no health insurance, sought relief for a toothache and visited an emergency room, where a physician prescribed him an antibiotic and pain medication. According to a relative, Willis couldn't afford the antibiotic he was prescribed, so he relied instead on medication to ease the pain. Eventually, the infection spread to his brain and killed him.

Garcia Named New Legislative Liaison for the Michigan Department of Community Health

The Michigan Department of Community Health has announced the appointment of Karla Garcia as Legislative Liaison for the Department effective Sept. 26. Ms. Garcia will work on behalf of the Department with members of the Michigan House of Representatives, Michigan Senate, legislative staff, and representatives in Governor Snyder's office. She replaces Tony Stamas, who left the Department to become Chief of Staff to Senate Majority Leader Randy Richardville.
